The United States District Court is seeking applications for appointment to the court's committee on Conduct. The Committee on Conduct presides over attorney disciplinary matters, as defined in D.C.COLO.LCivR 83.5B, and D.C.COLO.LCrR 57.7B. The Committee investigates and acts upon complaints against members of this court's bar, applications for reinstatement or readmission, and matters involving attorney disability.

There are currently 3 vacancies on the Committee. The term of each appointment is three years, and will commence on or about October 1, 2013. The Committee Member may be asked to serve up to two terms.

To be eligible for appointment to the Committee, an attorney must certify that he or she meets the following criteria:

1. has been practicing law for at least 10 years, with no disciplinary record, and;

2. is licensed to practice by the Colorado Supreme Court, and;

3. has been a member of and in good standing with this court's bar for at least 5 years, with no disciplinary record, and;

4. has experience that makes the applicant especially qualified to investigate matters governed by this Court's disciplinary rules and the Colorado Rules of Professional Conduct.

The Committee meets once a month. Committee members must be willing to attend all meetings, and must be prepared to devote significant time to investigate any assigned case.

Interested candidates shall submit a current resume and cover letter to the Clerk of Court no later than close of business on September 23, 2013.
