WHO MAY ATTEND: Defense counsel, pretrial defendants, families and friends of loved ones potentially facing federal incarceration.

This pilot program is a joint effort between the Bureau of Prisons, U.S. Probation and the Office for Child Support Enforcement which will target post-plea defendants and their loved ones. It is designed to educate families and help reduce the level of anxiety and fear associated with the possibility of federal incarceration and the criminal justice process. A panel member from each of the aforementioned agencies will provide general information regarding the federal sentencing process, voluntary surrender/designation, BOP rules, available programming, child support orders and the modification process. A question and answer session will be held at the conclusion of this program.

This information will also be made available to detained offenders housed at the Federal Detention Center-Englewood via videoconference and to the divisional offices in Grand Junction, Durango and Colorado Springs to maximize exposure (upon request).
