

INTERNS

I offer two or three unpaid internships each fall and spring semester, and up to four during the summer. Interns are assigned a variety of projects, given opportunities to attend trials and oral arguments, and receive constructive feedback on research, writing and analysis. Pre- and post-hearing confidential discussions give interns unique insight into the decisional process. Interns seeking a clerkship after graduation have the advantage of becoming acquainted with my chambers, and this exposure allows for more accurate screening for these full-time positions.

In selecting interns, I focus on student transcripts, writing samples and demonstrations of creativity. Interests predating law school and extracurricular activities are important. I am seeking interns who enjoy learning, who want to improve the quality of their writing, and who care about the law, other people and themselves; in short, those who combine character and intelligence.

Applicants should submit a cover letter, resume, transcripts and a short (5-10 pages) writing sample no later than September 30th for spring positions, May 31st for fall positions, and February 15th for summer positions. Send first year research and writing memos as a last resort only; my strong preference is for a writing sample on a topic unrelated to law.
