Upon representation by the offices of the United States Attorney, the Federal Public

Defender, and the United States Marshal for the District of Colorado, the Court finds that each

office will suffer significant budget reductions resulting in mandated furlough days in varying

number during the remainder of FY 2013. Because the participation of the professionals in these

offices is integral to proper adjudication of criminal matters before the Court, coordination in

scheduling of criminal trials and hearings is necessary to ensure access to the Court by all parties

and the public, appropriate representation to criminal defendants and necessary courthouse

security.

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that:

Beginning Friday, April 26, 2013 and continuing through September 30, 2013, no hearings

or trials in criminal cases (other than mandatory first appearances before a magistrate judge) will

be heard on Fridays. In addition, no trials or hearings in criminal cases in which a Federal Public

Defender must appear shall be conducted on Friday, March 29 and Friday, April 12, 2013. Parties

with existing criminal matters affected by this order shall coordinate with the opposing party, and

with the respective judicial chambers, to reschedule hearings/trials.
