## ORDER REGARDING COLLATERAL FORFEITURE SCHEDULE FOR USE BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT

THIS MATTER comes before the Court on application of the United States of America pursuant to Local Rule 58.1(h) of the Criminal Rules of the United States

District Court for the District of Colorado for approval of a collateral forfeiture schedule for use by the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management.

HAVING considered the application, and being fully advised in the premises, the Court makes the following FINDINGS:

- A. The proposed collateral forfeiture schedule was prepared according to the collateral forfeiture framework set out in D.C.COLO.LCrR 58.1.
- B. The proposed collateral forfeitures for standard offenses fall within the presumptive forfeiture ranges set out in the collateral forfeiture framework.
- C. The proposed collateral forfeitures for aggravated offenses fall within the presumptive collateral forfeiture ranges for aggravated offenses set out in the collateral forfeiture framework.

Therefore, pursuant to D.C.COLO.LCrR 58.1, the Court ORDERS as follows:

- A. The Court approves the Collateral Forfeiture Schedule attached as Exhibit

  A to this Order for use by the United States Department of the Interior Bureau of

  Land Management.
- B. The approved Collateral Forfeiture Schedule shall be kept on file with the Clerk's office.
