TERMINATION OF COVID-19 SPECIFIC ENTRY RESTRICTIONS DISTRICT COURT GENERAL ORDER 2024-2

WHEREAS, General Order 2023-5, while ordering that the Court will return to its pre COVID-19 operational posture and resume all normal operations, also included COVID-19 specific restrictions on entry into any courthouse or U.S. Probation Office of the United States District Court for the District of Colorado;

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control has released updated recommendations for how people can protect themselves and their communities from respiratory viruses, including COVID-19, constituting a unified approach to addressing risks from a range of common respiratory viral illnesses, such as COVID-19, flu, and RSV;

WHEREAS, COVID-19 specific entry requirements for courthouses and Probation Offices are no longer required; it is hereby

ORDERED that General Order 2023-5 is rescinded and that entrants into any courthouse or U.S. Probation Office of the United States District Court for the District of Colorado should follow the Center for Disease Control's recommendations for any common respiratory viral illness.
