IN THE UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT FOR THE DISTRICT OF COLORADO

IN THE MATTER OF COURT REPORTER AND ELECTRONIC COURT RECORDER DEPUTY CLERKS

Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 753(f), court reporters and electronic court recorders may charge and collect fees for transcripts requested by the parties, including the United States, at rates prescribed by the court subject to the approval of the Judicial Conference of the United States. In light of the aforementioned statutory authority for the district court to prescribe a schedule of fees for ordinary, expedited, daily, hourly and realtime transcripts, both government-paid and non-government paid,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

- 1) This Court will prescribe the fees which court reporters may charge and collect for transcripts requested by the parties, including the United States, at the current schedule of Maximum Transcript Rates set by the Judicial Conference of the United States, and each revised schedule set by the Conference will be adopted by this Court;
- 2) The Schedule of Transcript Fees, accompanied by a copy of this order, will be posted prominently in the clerk's office, and on the district court's internet website;
- 3) Neither the parties, nor the court reporter, nor the district court may negotiate a transcript rate higher than the applicable rate within the Schedule of Transcript Fees without Judicial Conference approval;
- 4) The cost for duplicate recordings of the Electronic Court Recording System shall follow the rate set by the court's Miscellaneous Fee Schedule;

- 5) Transcript formats shall follow the format guidelines approved by the Judicial Conference. *See* Guide to Judiciary Policy, Vol. 6, § 520 (Transcript Format);
- 6) Official court reporters and electronic court recorder deputy clerks shall not charge a fee for any copy of a transcript or tape delivered to the Clerk for the court's records. 28 U.S.C. § 753(f); and
- 7) This Order supersedes Administrative Order 2011-4 and all other orders setting transcript rates and defining transcript formats.
