**DISTRICT COURT GENERAL ORDER
2008-7**

The court has considered 28 U.S.C. § 2077 – Publication of Rules; Advisory Committees – and the statute’s requirement that each court that is authorized to prescribe rules of conduct of the court's business shall appoint an advisory committee for the study of the rules of practice and internal operating procedures. The court currently has in place such an advisory body, designated as the Local Rules Committee of the U.S. District Court, which makes recommendations to the court concerning such rules and procedures. Accordingly, to expressly conform to the statutory terminology, it is

ORDERED that the Local Rules Committee of the U.S. District Court is hereby renamed, with a new designation as the Advisory Committee on the Local Rules of Practice for the U.S. District Court, District of Colorado.
