

The United States District Court is seeking applications for appointment to the court's Committee on Conduct. The Committee on Conduct presides over attorney disciplinary matters as defined in D.C.COLO.LAttyR 6(c). The Committee investigates and acts upon complaints against members of this court's bar, applications for reinstatement or readmission, petitions for relief from the rule of good standing, and matters involving attorney disability.

There are currently **two** upcoming vacancies on the Committee. The term of the appointment is three years and will commence on or about October 1, 2023. Committee members should expect to serve two successive terms.

To be eligible for appointment to the Committee, an attorney must certify that he or she meets the following criteria:

1. has been practicing law for at least 10 years, with no disciplinary record;
2. is licensed to practice by the Colorado Supreme Court;
3. has been a member of and in good standing with this court's bar for at least 5 years, with no Record of discipline; and
4. has experience that makes the applicant especially qualified to investigate matters governed by this court's disciplinary rules and the Colorado Rules of Professional Conduct.

The Committee meets ten times during the year. Committee members must be willing to attend all meetings and must be prepared to devote significant time to investigate any assigned case. Members of the Committee shall serve without compensation; however, when practicable, necessary expenses are paid by the clerk from the fund in which admission and annual registration fees paid by members of the bar are deposited.

Interested candidates shall submit in PDF format a current resume and cover letter addressed to the Clerk of Court. The cover letter shall address how the candidate meets the above criteria. Applications may now be submitted no later than close of business on Friday, August 25, 2023.
